# 18 DESCRIBING FACE, HAIR, PATTERNS 

## INTRODUCTION

1. The sheet contains many of the same people, looking in opposite ways, with different hair color, and wearing different patterns. This will force students to understand the descriptive words that you use.
2. Look at the women, second row, third lady. She is also in the third row, third lady, and fourth row, first and fifth lady. She is the same lady, but she is facing different ways, and wearing different color patterns, and with different color hair.
3. Therefore, after you describe her (one of her) your students will have to understand terms such as facing right, left; dark hair, light hair; horizontal stripe, vertical stripe.
4. The lady who is in the second row, fifth and sixth has a low forehead and high forehead.
5. I describe the first lady in the first row simply by saying, She's not wearing makeup.
6. The man with the sunglasses who looks like a rock musician has on a horizontal stripe, diagonal stripe, and checkered shirt.
7. Look at the accountant-looking guy who is in the first row of men, fifth, and in the second row, fourth. One of them has his hair parted on the left, the other's hair is parted on the right.

## INSTRUCTIONS

1. Every student gets a sheet.
2. The teacher selects 10 women and 10 men to describe, and puts 1-10 next to the person they will describe. Then, you put your paper on a hard surface (glass is the best) and with a ball point pen, continually make circles until you have a hole cut out. This is your answer key.
3. I say: For practice, I will describe one lady. In the circle next to the lady I describe, write the letter 1. Got it? She is facing right, and has a serious expression on her face. She has short, white, curly hair and she is wearing a white top that has no collar. Where is her picture?

## 19 DESCRIBING From Scratch

## INTRODUCTION

This activity is to help students think, and describe from scratch. For example, a conversation might go like this:

A: How do you say blah blah blah in English?
B: What is blah blah blah?
A: It's the piece of paper, about the size of a movie ticket, that you buy at the subway station.
B: That's a subway token. Token.

Notice that there are numbers 1-6 on the right side of the sheet. Those are for describing:

1. People
2. University majors
3. Jobs
4. Things
5. Places
6. Personality or actions This is a person who, This type of person, You do this when. .

And. Because only 6 numbers are used, you could use a dice to liven up the activity.

## INSTRUCTIONS

1. Make copies and cut them as shown. Sit students in groups of 3 .
2. Self starter method: A picks a word, any word, and describes it. B and $\mathbf{C}$ try to guess and ask questions. They keep going until somebody guesses, then it is B's turn.
3. Pedantic method: A student describes a number 1. Then, when it is $\mathbf{B}$ 's turn, she describes a 2.
4. Then, $\mathbf{C}$ describes a 3. And so on.
5. Dice method: A rolls the dice. If it lands with 3 up, $\mathbf{A}$ describes a $\mathbf{3}$ JOB term. Then $\mathbf{B}$ rolls.
6. The pedantic and dice methods have the advantage of forcing students to use all 6 categories. If they can choose all the time, they may avoid some categories.

## AS A CONVERSATION STARTER

As always, this is a conversation class, and after about 20 minutes of doing this, students can be encouraged to talk about the people, places, majors and things that they are describing.

For example, after correctly guessing "Tom Cruise" a student might ask if another likes Tom Cruise, or who is their favorite movie star. Use the answers as conversation starters.

# 21 US Geography \& Directions 

## Clarifying confusion creates communicative competency.

## INTRODUCTION

1. This is an information gap activity, and has a version for 3 and 4 persons.
2. This activity is a little easier to understand and do than the street directions, so I do this activity first.
3. This can be used at any time, and fits in well with the Vacations unit in Jazz 1.
4. There are 48 states here. 48 divided by $3=16,48$ divided by $4=12$. Thus, each student will ask and receive directions at least 12 times.

## INSTRUCTIONS

1. Students sit in a group of 3 or 4 .
2. I go over the directions 1-4, and pronounce the prepositions and directions. They repeat.
3. When I am going over $4, I$ tell them that this is a chance to practice their bad-pad-fad vad; light, right, night, white pronunciation. They can emphasize the difference between $B$ and $D, M$ and $N$.
4. A goes first, and asks: What state is above, below, on the right, on the left of Kansas?
5. After the answer is given and spelled, everyone writes the name down in the proper place. Then, $\mathbf{B}$ goes.
6. There will be confusion and sometimes students will write the state name in the wrong place and this will start a chain reaction of mistakes. That's OK. Clearing up confusion creates communicative competency.

## POST-ACTIVITY ACTIVITY

1. Some groups will finish before others. Therefore, as groups finish I tell them to talk about places in America they have been to, or would like to go to, why, where, for how long. It's a conversation class.
2. After every group finishes, they open their Jazz book to the USA map and I pronounce the names of the states for them, starting with Washington, and going down and then up toward the east.
3. If time allows: I tell them that most states are Indian names: Ohio, Arkansas, Idaho, etc.
4. I explain that the state capitols are not the biggest city in the state, but rather the biggest city near the center of the state. This was to help voting in the old days of horses.
5. I explain the US highway system. Highways that go basically north and south have odd numbers, and begin on the west coast (highway 1) and end on the east coast (Interstate-95).
6. Highways that go east and west are even numbered, and start in the south. For example, Interstate 10 goes from lower California to Florida. The farther north you go, the higher number the highways.
7. Also, there are interstate loops around major cities, and the loops have 3-digit numbers. For example, the 610 loop around Houston.

## TALK OR WALK PRONUNCIATION

To help students pronounce states such as Wyoming and lowa correctly, I have included Jazz spelling in smaller letters underneath each state. The most common states, such as California and New York need no such help. Every student knows certain basics of English pronunciation, such as:

# 22 Street \& City Directions <br> Clearing up confusion creates communicative competency. 

## INTRODUCTION

1. This is an information gap activity, and has a version for 3 and 4 persons.
2. This activity is not to give directions TO somewhere, it is to say where something IS. This is the same type of activity as the US States, Directions and Prepositions.
3. This activity uses 40 common city and neighborhood places of business, thus each student will ask and answer questions at least 10 times.
4. Every student knows the same black buildings. When they first begin, it can be a little difficult to describe the locations, because some locations are not near a black building.
5. However, it gets progressively easier, because the more landmarks that are known (and the closer they are), the easier it is to describe the missing landmarks.

## INSTRUCTIONS

Students sit in a group of 3 or 4 .

1. I go over the directions 1-4, and pronounce the prepositions and directions, they repeat.
2. At the bottom, center of each page, are the places that the student is looking for. For example, the first location on A's list is the Bakery.
3. $\mathbf{A}$ asks: Does anyone know where the Bakery is? $\mathbf{C}$ will answer, $\mathbf{A}$ and $\mathbf{B}$ will write down Bakery in the proper place.
4. Then $\mathbf{B}$ will ask for a location on her list. Then $\mathbf{C}$.

## DETAILED INSTRUCTIONS

1. If you describe in 2 or 3 ways where something is, it is easier to find.
2. Your keys are on the coffee table, on the right side, next to your camera.
3. My neck is below my head and above my chest. It is between my shoulders and under my chin.
4. Encourage students to describe where something is using two or more descriptions.
5. For example: The 3-story villa is not square. It is a 5-sided building that is southwest of the traffic light. It is across the street from the short brick building, on the left.

## THINKING OUTSIDE THE BOX

6. Students can use anything to describe. For example: The health club is shaped like a big slice of pizza, and it is right next to the big tree on the short block. It's shaped like one-fourth of a pie.
7. The fruit stand is the smallest building to the right of the apartment complex. It's a rectangle, not a square.

## POST-ACTIVITY ACTIVITY

Some groups will finish sooner than others. When they do, I tell them to talk about what they did last weekend, or last semester break, or next weekend. Talk. It's a conversation class.
